Camp Juliette is located on 27 wooded acres within the city limits of Marshalltown. The area features lots of spring wildflowers and animal life. Deer are an almost common sight. An old stagecoach trail once crossed the property and is still visible. The lodge is a two level frame structure that is energy efficient. The upper level has two sleeping areas, a small meeting room, two bathrooms, and six exits to the outside deck overlooking the Juliette grounds

Camp Neyati is located 14 miles south of Council Bluffs, 2 ¼ miles off Wabash Avenue/County Road L35 opposite the Mineola turnoff. The camp is a beautiful area of woods and meadows, nestled on 280 acres of natural bluffs. Visitors to camp will see deer, wild turkeys, owls, hawks and a variety of songbirds thriving in their natural habitat. The camp facilities include a fully winterized lodge equipped with kitchen and bath facilities; four camp units with nine small cabins, latrines, showers and a covered shelter house with an indoor fireplace. The man-made lake includes a swimming area. Canoes, rowboats and pedal boats are available and should be requested at the time you reserve camp.

Camp Sacajawea is located about 6 1/2 miles northwest of Boone on over 400 acres of wooded ravines and plateaus bordering the Des Moines River. The crystal clear blue water in the large swimming pool is a nice refresher on Iowa's hot humid summer days. Newly remodeled shower facilities for both sexes adjoins the pool. All buildings at Camp Sacajawea are handicap accessible.

Camp Tanglefoot The camp is situated on 50 acres along the Tanglefoot Bay of Clear Lake, and includes woodlands, reconstructed prairie, lake access and large game field. There are five summer camp living areas (three platform tent units, and two cabin units). The camp also boasts a warm, traditional dining Lodge (1950), two year-round fully-equipped retreat buildings (Oaks and Meadowview), Craft House, 2 large shower buildings with soft water, and a fleet of 32 boats at our waterfront complex

Rosetree Cabin Located in the city park in Centerville, Rosetree Cabin is good for small groups. There are banquet tables and chairs for eating or meeting and the large program room has a fireplace and an open beam ceiling. The kitchen has a refrigerator and a stove. This cabin is a comfortable setting for small groups

Camp Joy Hollow sits on 360 acres of great natural beauty with hills, trails, and broad vistas nestled into the surroundings of the famed Loess Hills. It affords a perfect setting for both indoor and outdoor year-round troop activities. The facilities include a lodge, ground fire rings, playing field, a primitive camp site, tent camping area, swimming pool and new picnic

shelter. There are six "Treehouse" style sleeping cabins for resident campers. Our unique environment lends a special sense to the evening campfires and active programming.
